To Our Friends & Partners

We believe in the importance of providing our friends and partners with regular progress updates. Giving you an idea of what we are aiming to achieve in the period ahead. Also allows for better transparency and the ability to stay connected to what we are doing.

First quarter, 2022 in perspective

After establishing a three year's plan at the end of 2021, Spread Life has been working diligently to cement its work along that path. In the first quarter of 2022 we were able to:

- Initiate our service in Zahle, (starting with serving 25 families).
- Establish relationships with well-known local and international NGOs in order to benefit from their experience, and find joint collaboration opportunities.
- Research options that provide proper local financial sustainability; we therefore started a catering service specialized for retreats and a beekeeping project to produce organic honey.

Looking Ahead

Throughout the 1st Quarter lots of prayer and meetings have taken place to prepare for the Syriac Youth Global Gathering which will be held in Lebanon in July 2022. We are still working diligently on the community service program for that gathering which will be under the management of Spread Life. The youth participating in SYGG will experience serving with Spread Life, as we believe this will be a life changing experience for them (stirring their hearts and developing empathy towards each other). We will also be renovating TMS school during SYGG's community service program.

Furthermore, we are looking to progressively increase the number of families we serve especially in Zahle, and enhance our collaboration with local and international NGOs for a more efficient service.

We hope that you continue to pray for our work so our Lord would give us wisdom, courage, and strength to carry on our mission.

Programs by Numbers

Spread Life’s mission is to reach out and spread God’ love to our communities and offer a helping hand to those in need. Our service therefore is not restricted to providing medical, pantry, education and other form of support, but it requires us to be near our beneficiaries through routine visits.

Beneficiaries that are being supported with medical, pantry, and some kind of subsidy support are visited on a monthly basis. Spending around 45 minutes with each family in order to pray with them and offer them comfort and encouragement so they would be strong in facing life’s challenges.

Students that are part of the pastoral program are being followed up by Spread Life at least once every 2 months. We spend around an hour and a half with each student in order to discuss their educational progression and decisions, offer career guidance, and provide personal support.

The table below depicts statistical figures relating to the 1st Quarter of 2022 according to average monthly rate; hence during the 1st Quarter, Spread Life have provided Pantry Boxes for an average of 230 families. Moreover, we account for the number of service hours deployed on average every month. On average Spread Life spends 185 hours to visit 260 households to provide their medicine bags, pantry boxes, rent and cash subsidies.

Walk with us in our Service

Educational Program

- Our mission helped 2 siblings to enter school after missing out for two years due to financial difficulties; their parents' lost financial hope to enroll their children.
- Helping 1 student with autism to go to a specialized school has changed his life and his family's lives as well.
- A university student who lost hope to continue her degree due to the financial situation witnessed God's blessing and joy through Spread Life's support thus establishing a spirit of gratitude in that family's life.

Pastoral Program

- Supporting one of our youth's decisions to change his university specialty has shifted his excitement towards continuing his education in what he desires and excels in.
- Helping 1 youth know that one of his habits was illegal and giving him the means to develop the sense of what is right and wrong has started to create in him a mature personality that could face life's peer pressure.
- Encouraging our youth to serve in church has developed their commitment to church.

Medical Program

- Spread Life was able to provide the related cancer medicine for one of its beneficiaries who had given up on the possible provision of this medicine.
- An imprisoned husband and father had a tremendous change in lifestyle, both spiritually and socially, with the help of our service as a result of the regular visits and tangible support. Now out of jail, he has 2 jobs and is reunited with his family (after they wanted to distance themselves from him given the situation). Our help for the wider dysfunctional family (his parents, sisters and brother) through pantry boxes, medical support, and education has left its mark on the family (most of whom are now regularly reading the Bible).

Kitchen Program

- Spread Life succeeded in absorbing the stressful chore of providing food on the table of a cancer patient's family by delivering daily hot meals to her and her husband.
- We mourn the passing away of one of our Kitchen Program beneficiaries.

Pantry Program

- While distributing a pantry box to one of our beneficiary families, we noted two children shivering from the cold, accordingly, the responsible servant provided 40 Liters of fuel for the moderate heating means at their household.
